Fairfield Association Lone Worker Policy January 2022

The Association's ADVICE is that volunteers should not work alone in isolated parts of the Nature Reserve. We also ADVISE that lone workers carry a mobile telephone and a whistle and familiarise themselves with the Safety Advice included in the Fields Access Policy.

Insofar as a volunteer works alone on the Reserve the Association's REQUIREMENT is that:

- Another person is informed of where the volunteer is working and when s/he is expected back.
- That other person is informed who to contact in the event of an emergency.
- The work done is with the agreement of the Volunteer Organiser.

The Association also requires co-working with the use of potentially dangerous machines and tools in isolated areas. For further detail see the Association's general *Risk Assessment for Volunteer Sessions* which specifies requirements for working with tools, machines, at height and in water.
